

## The week in Year 3 and 4

This week Year 3 and 4 have been focusing on our senses during English to support us writing our pyramid setting description. We were given the challenge to also include fronted adverbials, prepositions and rhetorical questions if we felt it was appropriate and we all produced some amazing work with excellent vocabulary.

We have been continuing our focus on plants during science and completed an experiment to investigate how water is transported through a plant by using celery, food colouring, water and a glass jar and were able to write our predictions and conclusions in lots of detail.

In History we continued our work on Ancient Egypt by learning about Howard Carter and why he might be an important person in our inquiry into life in Ancient Egypt.

## The week in Year 5 and 6

#### Science

Miss Thomas thought we needed to get out onto the playground and demonstrate how the planets in our Solar System move around the Sun. This was a great way to also visualise how the *heliocentric* model exists (where the planets move around the Sun) as many years ago, scientists believed that everything moved around the Earth (*geocentric*). Some people also believed that the Earth was flat but we can now prove that it is not.



## **English**
