
Please refer to the graphic below which shows the significant impact of absence over time.










Will Writing Services

Making a Will / Your Estate Planning

A Will is one of the most important legal documents you will ever prepare and sign in your life.

It allows you to control what should happen to your assets and belongings (money, property, personal items etc.) as well as your children ofter you have died. If you want to leave your estate in a certain way, it is necessary to plan chead and have a Will. Good planning protects your family and ensures your affairs are in order to minimise inheritance Tax.

What happens if I die without making a Will?

If you die without a valid Will in England or Wales the law specifies who will benefit from your assets.

If you have no living family members, all your property and possessions will go to the Crown / State. If you have children under 18 years old it will be up to the courts to appoint a guardian for your child - and the court may not make the same choice that you would.

Not having a Will in place can unfortunately leave behind chaos, inconvenience and distress, which can be easily avoided.
