Headteacher Update

Every child has the right to a good education. We want our children to thrive, and to be healthy and happy. For this to happen the majority of young people need to be attending school, seeing their friends, and learning in the classroom. Most children in England agree with this assessment. The Children's Commissioner for England's 'Big Ask' survey from March 2022 gathered over 550 000 responses from children and demonstrated during the pandemic how much they had missed face-to-face teaching, spending time with their friends, and the extra-curricular activities that brought joy and excitement to their lives.

The benefits of school are many. It offers positive adult role models and gives children a strong foundation for their interactions in society. School helps young people build confidence, which is crucial to healthy self-esteem. It encourages independent critical thinking and self-expression. These skills translate to every area of life, whether it is in academia, the workplace, or relationships. School widens a child's horizons and influences their aspirations. Schools are more than just classrooms, they are communities.

The week in Willow class

This week we have worked very hard. It is lovely to see everyone growing in confidence now that we have spent a lot of time together. We now know lots of new letters and phonics, the children are enjoying being able to attempt to read simple words. We have continued our work on the story 'It's okay to be different' by Todd Parr. We have thought about why it is okay to be different and made our own version of the story. The ideas we had were, it's okay to...

- Have different-coloured hair.
- Have different coloured eyes.
- Be 4 or 5.
- Come to school on the bus.
- Be in the best class in the school.

These are some fantastic differences that we all agreed on.



In our maths lessons we have been focusing on the numbers 1,2 and 3. We have found 1 and 2 items within the classroom and matched them to the right number. We have thought about the different ways to make 3 using the 10's frames and counters.



We have also thought about lots of patterns we can see and make. We have focused on making patterns using 1 and 2 colours.

A very busy week for everyone, and we even had time to spend lots of time playing!

Maple Class have been learning about the Solar System in Science, putting the eight planets in order from the sun. We used a mnemonic to help us remember the order correctly!




The week in Alder class

In English we have continued our work around the class text 'Anglo-Saxon Boy'. We have been focusing on different features of a diary entry and then picking apart the difference between fact and opinion and also understanding how to show emotion through our writing.

We have loved learning about the Anglo-Saxons in History and this week focused on what Sutton Hoo tells us about the Anglo-Saxon world. The children enjoyed looking at different artefacts and drawing images of what they believed the burial scene would have looked like.

In Science we have been learning about electricity and this week it was great to create our own circuits and understand how electricity travels and what can impact the circuit working.



Well done on a fantastic week Alder class and I hope you all have a restful weekend!




