Have a lovely weekend everyone! There are more photos on Tapestry for you to see Christmas jumper day, letter and list writing and our visit to Belsay shop.


A big thank you to everyone for your support this week! It really does make a difference and I feel very lucky to be part of the best class in the school!

## This week in Maple Class





We have written some amazing diary entries, imagining that we are Parvana's father in his jail cell and we've discussed the awful conditions that he is living in. As we continue to read, we hope that the future for him and his family improves. We have had some thought-provoking discussions around war, conflict and peace and how we can empathise with those people across the world who are facing persecution.



Linked to our story in English, we have been producing some wonderful war-torn sketches in Art and focussed on the images available to us as inspiration for our own designs. Over the next few weeks we will continue to edit and improve our work and begin using monoprinting to enhance our masterpieces.
