

In Computing, our focus has been giving and acting on instructions in both group work and when using the Bee Bots. We were even able to work out which instructions the Bee Bot had been given without seeing which buttons had been pressed.

Everyone challenged themselves to make this writing as creative as possible and use exciting vocabulary to enhance it.


In Maths we have also started our new topics. Year 3 have been looking at mass and what this means before comparing the mass of different objects. Year 4 have started to look at decimals and have been linking their knowledge of tenths as a fraction to create a decimal.

History was so much fun this week as we began looking at the importance of Gods and Goddesses in Ancient Greece. My favourite part was definitely all the children comparing myself to the different Goddesses. I have been so amazed by how much the children know and how much they go home to learn even more. We then made our own top trump cards for the different Gods and Goddesses to deepen our understanding of their different strengths and weaknesses to help us know how they were important in different scenarios.

Thursday was a very busy day but everyone challenged themselves whilst still having fun. It looks like the boys had an amazing day! They started off by measuring and preparing their wood to create their bridge and worked well as a team. They then spent the rest of the afternoon working on their football skills with Mr A! Well done on all your hard work boys! The KS2 girls were out for the day performing at The North East Primary Dance Festival at Dame Allen's school. They performed their piece before taking part in a workshop and I am bursting with pride at how professional and talented they are! Well done girls! We are so lucky to have such a variety of talents in our class and this week has highlighted just how amazing you all are.
