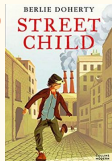


Core Texts

RE: Christianity.

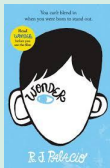
French: Alphabet, months and celebrations

Focus: Discrimination and stereotypes.

Project Outcome: To understand the impacts of stereotyping, prejudice and discrimination and how to challenge these.

Geography: Locating Mayan countries and cities using atlases.
